Eighty percent of our client's (and their affected families) live on or under Indiana's poverty level. Many of their "wishes" are actual necessities, and our hope is to be able to allow people to receive a gift that they might not ordinarily be able to afford.

In addition to a gift, this year we are hoping to also provide a food /daily living gift basket to each person and/or family (food, toiletries, cleaning supplies, etc.). This will require some food drives in order to accomplish. Donors may express an interest in "adopting" a client, a family or both (this year we have many more client's with children than in the past years, so our need is even greater) and in return I give them an individual's "wish list" (via email). We will have specific gift drop off times at our office throughout the end of November and December in order to help facilitate getting gifts to clients in a timely manner. This will be the 10th year that Gifts of Grace has helped Positive Link clients experience the kindness that the Bloomington Community has to offer during the Holiday season.
