



DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION COMMISSION SERVICE DAY INITIATIVE - A DAY ON! NOT A DAY OFF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS



The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Birthday Celebration Commission of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, invites proposals for funding for service activities beginning on or around the federal holiday, January 18, 2010. The average grant amount will depend upon the number and quality of proposals selected for funding. We anticipate that funding will be in the \$250 to \$500 range.

Project Emphasis

Projects will be approved for funding based upon the following criteria. The proposed service activity will:

- **Get necessary things done in the community** – address education, public safety, environmental, or other human needs through direct service and citizen action;
- **Strengthen the community through engaging in service activity** – bring people together in pursuit of a common objective that is of value to the community;
- **Reflect the life and teaching of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.** – demonstrate Dr. King’s proposition that “Everybody can be great, because everyone can serve”;
- **Begin or occur in significant part on the federal holiday (January 18, 2010)** and include on-going volunteer components according to the needs of your organization.

Please note:

- **Projects which include continued service during “40 Days of Peace” are particularly encouraged.**
- **Projects which involve disadvantaged youth* in service activities or as recipients of service are particularly encouraged.**
[*Disadvantaged youth, as defined by the Corporation for National and Community Service, are youth up to 24 years in age, who, because of certain characteristics, circumstances, experiences or insufficiencies, encounter financial, legal, social, educational, emotional and/or health problems and may have significant difficulties growing into adults who are responsible citizens, productive workers, involved members of communities, and good parents.]

Examples of Project Activities

The direct service may include but is not limited to the following types of activities:

tutoring children or adults • feeding the hungry, packing lunches or delivering meals • stocking a food or clothing pantry • repairing a school and/or adding to its resources • translating books and documents • collaborations which bring together communities of faith and secular human service programs • renovating low-income or senior housing • removing graffiti or painting a mural • organizing health fairs • collecting oral histories of elders • restoring a public space • organizing a blood drive • community-wide serve-a-thons that bring a broad cross-section together, including schools or school districts that seek to involve students and teachers in joint service • service-learning projects that link students in schools and universities with community organizations

Grant Limitations

- Grants under this program may constitute federal assistance and may not be used to inhibit or advance religion in a material way; award may not be used to fund religious instruction, worship or proselytization.
- No part of an award may be used to pay honoraria or fees for speakers.
- Funds should not be requested to support a celebration banquet or other activity not connected to service.

Eligible Applicants

Applicants are limited to entities located in Monroe County, Indiana and may include not-for-profit organizations, businesses, faith organizations, schools, community and neighborhood organizations, public and private agencies, student organizations, and governmental entities.

Period of Support

Funding must be used prior to 5/31/10. If the source of your funding is federal, an earlier deadline may apply.
