ORDINANCE 88- 42

To Add a Subsection to Title 15 of the Bloomington
Municipal Code Entitled "Vehicles and Traffic"

WHEREAS, the Indiana Statute IC 36-1-3-5 authorizes a City to exercise any power that is not expressly denied by the Constitution or by statute and is not expressly granted to another entity, and

WHEREAS, if there is no provision requiring a specific manner for exercising a power, a city must adopt an ordinance, and

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington Police Department is increasingly asked to take fingerprints of civilians for non-criminal reasons including, for example, application to sit for bar examinations, naturalization applications, job applications for state and federal jobs, passports and visas, and security checks, these requests exceed the official duty of the Police Department and are time consuming,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT THE FOLLOWING SUBSECTION OF TITLE 15 BE AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. A new section numbered 15.08.010 is added to Title 15 of the Bloomington Municipal Code to read as follows:

15.08.060 - Fee for Fingerprinting for Non-Criminal Purposes.

The Bloomington Police Department may charge a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) to fingerprint any person who requires the prints for reasons other than official business of the Police Department or any City Department.

Section II. Requests for fingerprints for child protection shall be exempt from this fee.

Section III. Funds from these fees shall be deposited weekly in the City's General Fund.

Section IV. Severability. If any section, sentence or provision of this ordinance shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other sections, sentences, provisions, or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this section are declared to be severable.

Section V. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, approval by the Mayor, and promulgated according to law.

SYNOPSIS

This new section requested by the Police Department authorizes a fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for all non-official fingerprinting records except in the case of prints for child protection.

ORDINANCE 88- 43

To Amend Title 15 of the Bloomington Municipal
Code Entitled "Vehicles and Traffic"

WHEREAS, within a joint meeting of representatives of the City of Bloomington Legal Department, the Bloomington Police Department, and the authorized towing operators under contract to the Bloomington Police Department, it was recommended that changes to the towing procedure used by the Bloomington Police Department be made;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED By the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, that:

SECTION I. Section 15.48.030(a) shall be amended to read as follows:

The maximum amount that an authorized towing service may charge for towing or removing a vehicle under this chapter shall not exceed thirty-five dollars (\$35.00), except where special treatment may be required. The maximum amount that the service may charge for an arrival on the scene in response to a request by a police officer is fifteen dollars (\$15.00). The service may charge the towing fee after hook-up, if the owner/operator wishes to retrieve the vehicle. Should the owner wish to retrieve his vehicle from the service after its regular business hours, in addition to any towing and storage charges, an amount not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) may be charged. The maximum amount that may be charged for storage shall not exceed five dollars (\$5.00) per day.

SECTION II. Section 15.52.060 shall be amended to read as follows:

The maximum amount that an authorized towing service may charge for towing or removing a vehicle under this chapter shall not exceed thirty-five dollars (\$35.00), except where special treatment may be required. The maximum amount that the service may charge for an arrival on the scene in response to a request by a police officer is fifteen dollars (\$15.00). The service may charge the towing fee after hook-up, if the owner/operator wishes to retrieve the vehicle. Should the owner wish to retrieve his vehicle from the service after its regular business hours, in addition to any towing and storage charges, an amount not to exceed five dollars (\$5.00) may be charged. The maximum amount that may be charged for storage shall not exceed five dollars (\$5.00) per day.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

This Ordinance makes several changes to the towing charges delineated in Title 15. The Ordinance is designed to reflect the increased costs to the towing operators since the earlier passage of these sections. It adds the allowable charge of a "call fee" when the owner arrives to retrieve his vehicle before it actually has been moved. In addition, it adds an after hours retrieval fee to allow for the inconvenience to the towing operators.
