

ORDINANCE 81- 61

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-35-81, and recommended that the petitioner, I.U. Foundation and others, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from BL-limited business district to BG-general commercial district for property located at 1801 -1901 East 10th Street more particularly described as follows:

Lots 10, 11, 12, 13 & 14, Ray Rogers Addition (owners of record, Indiana University Foundation)

Lot 15, Ray Rogers Addition (owner of record, Mrs. Marie Peterson)

Lots 16 & 17, Ray Rogers Addition (owners of record, Violet D. & Carl H. Snoddy, John Huntington, Katina Hrisomalos)


A parcel of land in the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 34, Township 9 North, Range 1 West of the Second Principal Meridian, said parcel being more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the Southwest corner of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 34; thence North 114 feet to a point, said point being 50 feet South of the center line of the Indianapolis Southern Railway, thence South 79 degrees 00 minutes East parallel to and 50 feet distant, Southwesterly at right angles from the center line of the main track of the Indianapolis Southern Railway a distance of 558.7 feet, more or less, to a point in the South line of the said Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter, thence West along the said South line of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter to the point of beginning; except 30 feet of even width off the South end of the above described parcel which is now used for highway and street purposes.


SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.


