PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and the City of Bloomington's 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan, the City of Bloomington is required to publish an Amendment to the 2014 Annual Action Plan of Community Development Objectives and Projected Use of Funds and invite citizens to examine this statement and submit comments on the proposed statement and on the community development performance of the City. A Public Hearing will be conducted to receive comments on this Amendment on Monday, December 1, 2014 at 5:00 PM in the McCloskey Room in City Hall located at 401 North Morton Street, Bloomington, Indiana. The statement is printed below. Box 100, Bloomington, IN 47402 on or before December 30, 2014. CITY OF BLOOMINGTON OBJECTIVE. Bloomington's general strategy for community development is to strengthen Bloomington's neighborhoods, as outlined in the Consolidated Plan 2010-2014, and to provide stability to economically disadvantage populations through housing and services. The City currently has \$400,000 in unprogrammed funds and would like to allocate these funds and available program income to an activity that was previously included and funded in the City's 2013 and 2014 Annual Action Plans. This activity is the Rockport Road Reconstruction Project. Major objectives under the Community Development Block Grant Program include: A. Create or improve infrastructure in target areas; B. Encourage Neighborhood stabilization; and C. Provide financial and technical assistance to increase infrastructure accessibility to persons with disabilities.

CDBG PROJECTED USE OF FUNDS: Program Name: Rockport Road Reconstruction Project. Implementing Agency: City of Bloomington's Planning and Transportation Department. Service Provided: Reconstruction of approximately 1,700 linear feet of roadway including but not limited to curbs, sidewalks, storm drainage management system, new roadway, engineering and acquisition of rights of way. Location/Population Served: Low/Moderate Income Area within the City limits. Funding: \$400,000 and available program income. Eligibility Cite: 570.201(c) and 570.208.(a)(1).
