ORDINANCE NO. 65-4

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE "MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, 1957" BY AMENDING SECTIONS 27 and 28 OF CHAPTER 21 OF SAID CODE WITH REFERENCE TO REGISTRATION OF PLUMBERS.

SECTION 1. That the "Municipal Code of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, 1957", be amended by amending Chapter 21, Section 27, to read as follows:

Section 21-27. Required--Generally.


It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the plumbing business or practice of plumbing, either as a plumbing contractor or journeyman plumber, unless such person has been duly registered as a plumbing contractor or journeyman plumber under the terms and provisions of this article. The City Engineer shall issue interim licenses to individuals who qualify by satisfying the City Engineer that they are capable of performing the tasks of a journeyman plumber and such interim license shall expire at the end of thirty (30) days or upon the date the next meeting of the plumbing board, whichever occurs later.

Section 21-28. Same--Exception.


The registration requirements set forth in the preceding section, shall not apply to the installation, remodeling or repair of plumbing of a one-family residential dwelling by the owner thereof.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana and approval by the Mayor.


