Re: National Highway System (NHS) and National Truck Network

Background

In August 2013, INDOT initiated a request of all Indiana MPOs for a comprehensive review of the National Highway System (NHS), National Truck Network, and federal functional classification networks within their respective jurisdictions. For each of these networks, the Federal Highway Administration has final approval for modifications, and accepts modification requests from the States. States are required to show cooperation/coordination with local agencies and MPOs, which is the cause of INDOT's 2013 request of Indiana MPOs.

The TAC and CAC have previously approved local recommendations for each of these networks, most recently at their meeting on August 26, 2015. On September 11, 2015, the Policy Committee moved to defer this issue to allow for further review.

To assist with this review, members of each of the MPO committees were invited to attend an informational discussion with representatives from the Federal Highway Administration and INDOT. That discussion took place on October 29, 2015, and was well attended by representatives from each of the MPO committees, the City of Bloomington, and Monroe County. At that time, the group discussed a path forward in which the NHS and National Truck Network review would be undertaken separately from the federal functional classifications.

National Highway System (NHS)

The *National Highway System (NHS)* was established in 1995 as a strategic network of roadways that are important to the nation's economy, defense, and mobility. It includes the Interstate Highway System and other roads serving major airports, ports, rail or truck terminals, railway stations, pipeline terminals and other strategic transportation facilities of national significance.

Section 103(b) of title 23, U.S.C., allows the States to propose modifications to the NHS and authorizes the Secretary of the Department of Transportation to approve such modifications provided they meet the criteria established for the NHS and enhance the characteristics of the NHS. In proposing modifications, the States must cooperate with local and regional officials. In urbanized areas, local officials must act through the MPO designated for that area. According to 23 CFR 470A, proposed additions to the NHS should be included in either an adopted State or metropolitan transportation plan (see excerpt from INDOT's *2013-2035 Future Needs Report*).

To ensure that roadways on the NHS meet standards appropriate for their intended use, highways on the NHS must comply with additional federal regulations, including those for design standards, contract administration, State-FHWA oversight procedures, Highway Performance Monitoring System reporting, National Bridge Inventory reporting, national performance measures data collection, and outdoor advertisement/junkyard control.

Bloomington/Monroe County Metropolitan Planning Organization

In October 2012, the MAP-21 federal legislation automatically added to the NHS those roads that were at that time functionally classified as principal arterials but not yet part of the NHS. Nationally, this include many roads owned by local jurisdictions, including the City of Bloomington (see map of existing NHS network).

Over the course of recent discussions regarding the NHS, answers to some key questions should be emphasized:

- **If a local roadway is added to the NHS, will it be eligible for additional funding?** No. INDOT has stated that the inclusion of a route on the NHS will not provide local governments with additional funding opportunities for newly designated routes.
- **If a state highway is added to the NHS, will maintenance or improvements on the roadway be eligible for additional funding sources?** Improvements on NHS roads can be funded using National Highway Performance Program (NHPP) funds. However, “maintenance” activities such as mowing and pot-hole patching are not eligible for federal reimbursement. Additionally, states do not receive additional federal funds because they increase NHS mileage.

A recommended network for the NHS in Monroe County is included in this packet, in map format as well as a listing of roadways. This recommendation is intended to most closely align with state and local plans, and federal guidelines for the NHS. It includes the following changes to the existing network:

- Removes all local roadways added to the NHS in 2012.
- Removes State Road 45, west of I-69.

National Truck Network

The *National Truck Network* was established by the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 as a national network of highways designated for use by large trucks. On these highways, Federal width and length limits apply. The National Truck Network includes almost all of the Interstate Highway System and other, specified non-Interstate highways. The network comprises more than 200,000 miles of highways.

Currently, there are no funding sources specifically associated with the National Truck Network, nor are any new funding sources planned.

A recommended network for the National Truck Network in Monroe County is included in this packet, in map format as well as a listing of roadways. It includes the following changes to the existing network:

- Removes State Road 45, west of I-69.
- Adds I-69.

Action Requested

The Technical Advisory Committee and the Citizens Advisory Committee are asked approve recommendations for the National Highway System and National Truck Network as presented in this packet.

Statewide System Planning Mobility Corridors

INDOT's long-range planning process is based upon a mobility corridor hierarchy system for statewide prioritization. This hierarchy has three levels:

- Statewide Mobility Corridors**
 These corridors are the top-end of the highway system, and are meant to provide mobility across the state. They provide safe, high-speed connections for long-distance trips between the metropolitan areas of Indiana, and those of the surrounding states. They serve as the freight arteries of the state, and thus, vital for economic development. INDOT has as a strategic goal to directly connect metropolitan areas of 25,000 in population or greater.
- Regional Corridors**
 These corridors are the middle tier of the highway system, and are meant to provide mobility within regions of the state. They provide safe, high-speed connections for medium-distance trips between smaller cities and towns.
- Sub-Regional Corridors**
 These corridors make up the remainder of highway system. They are the bottom level of the system, and are used for safe, lower speed, short-distances trips. They provide access between local land uses and the rest of the state network.




FIGURE 2 - INDOT MOBILITY CORRIDOR HIERARCHY MAP





Re: Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Application

Background

The Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) provides federal funding to LPAs for projects that reduce fatal and incapacitating injury crashes on the local road network. The following memo outlines the submitted project applications and provides a recommendation for the awarding of HSIP funds.

Project Applications

One HSIP project application has been submitted to the MPO by the City of Bloomington. Detailed project descriptions can be found in the attached application materials. This is a new project that is not currently shown in the FY 2014-2017 TIP. The City of Bloomington has requested for their project, Pedestrian Safety and Accessibility at Signalized Intersections, \$563,500 in HSIP funding in FY 2018. This project will install pedestrian signal heads with countdown timers and accessible pedestrian push buttons at City-maintained traffic signals and pedestrian hybrid beacons. The project will also install or improve curb ramps and install or refresh crosswalks at these locations as needed. All work will comply with PROWAG, the City's adopted accessibility guidelines.

The attached list and map show the 26 locations identified for this project. As currently scoped, the project would result in 182 new pedestrian signal heads with countdown timers, 186 new accessible pedestrian push buttons, and 83 new or improved curb ramps (see attached map and list). Final designs produced during Preliminary Engineering may determine that implementation at a particular location would require additional work beyond the intended scope or funding of this project and may result in removal of one or more locations from the project. Alternatively, Preliminary Engineering may also identify additional high priority signalized intersections that require accessible pedestrian buttons or countdown timers.

Crashes involving pedestrians are more likely to result in a fatality or incapacitating injury than crashes involving only motor vehicles. Pedestrian crashes are also much more likely to occur at street intersections than other locations because pedestrians leave the physical separation of a sidewalk and interact with vehicular traffic. Motor vehicle volumes at signalized intersections are generally much higher than other intersections, which results in increased exposure for pedestrians needing to cross the street. Thus, safety improvements for pedestrians at signalized intersections can result in substantial reductions in the risk of crashes that result in fatalities or incapacitating injuries.

Pedestrian signal indications have been widely reported to improve both safety and operations and they are standard at modern traffic signals. These indications are critical to communicate when pedestrians should cross the street in order to reduce conflicts between pedestrians and vehicles. However, older equipment limits the benefits of these pedestrian indications to only a portion of the population. Accessible push buttons are able to unambiguously communicate crossing guidance to individuals with visual impairments or other physical disabilities who may otherwise receive less or no guidance and be exposed to higher crash risk. In addition, countdown timers provide the further benefit of informing users how much time they have left to cross the road. Documented crash reduction factors indicate that implementation of countdown timers could result in a 25% reduction of pedestrian crashes that result in injury or fatality.




Some of the locations in this project will require adding pedestrian signals where there is currently no indication for pedestrians, but the majority of the locations will involve upgrading existing pedestrian signals to include countdown timers, accessible push buttons, and accessible curb ramps.

Preliminary Engineering and Land Acquisition will be 100% locally funded. Construction and construction engineering is proposed to be 90% federal funding with 10% local match. The estimated total federally funded portion of the project is \$507,150.



The City of Bloomington has requested four amendments to the TIP. The first amendment is to add the project titled: Pedestrian Safety and Accessibility at Signalized Intersections (DES# to be assigned). The project will fund the installation of pedestrian push buttons and countdown heads at various signalized intersections. Both the preliminary engineering and right-of-way phases will be paid for with local funds only while the construction phase will utilize federal funds. The project will utilize \$563,500 total in HSIP funding in FY 2018. The federal/local split for the construction phase is \$507,150 federal and \$56,350 local.

The City of Bloomington has also asked that the Moore’s Pike Guardrail (DES# 1500377) project be removed. The City has decided to pursue the project using local funds only. They have asked that the funds originally allocated to the Moore’s Pike Guardrail project be reallocated to both the Allen & Walnut St. RRFB (DES# 1500378) and the 4th St. & Rogers St. Pedestrian Island (DES# 1500379). 
