## **ORDINANCE 98-56**

## TO AMEND <u>ORDINANCE 98-34</u> WHICH FIXED THE SALARIES OF APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON FOR THE YEAR 1999 (Reinstating the Position of Assistant Golf Course Manager)

NOW BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

1. From and after January 1, 1999, the following classified position, salary and pay schedule be added to Section I of <u>Ordinance 98-34</u>, fixing the salaries and pay of Appointed Officers and Employees of the City in 1999, as indicated below:

## SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends <u>Ordinance 98-34</u> which fixed the salaries for officers and employees of the City for 1999. The amendment reinstates the position of Assistant Golf Course Manager, which was deleted in the original ordinance and replaced with two new "Specialist" positions. The Parks and Recreation Department intends to keep the Assistant Manager position filled until the employee holding that position departs next year, and then leave the Assistant Manager position vacant and fill the two specialist positions.

Note: This ordinance was considered on the night it was introduced after the appropriate motion we sunanimously approved by the eight council members present. The ordinance was amended by adding a new Section 2 and by renumbering the existing Section 2. The amendment and or linance as amended received a vote of 8 - 0.

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
