WHEREAS, Bloomington aspires to the ideal of being a safe and civil community; and

WHEREAS, the right of every person to live without harassment or fear should be unfettered;
and


WHEREAS, during recent months flyers and brochures have been distributed in the
community and at the university; and

WHEREAS, because this material incites fear, prolongs ignorance and racial and cultural
stereotyping, and detracts from good order, it demands a strong, unequivocal,
united response from the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:


1. The Common Council reaffirms its conviction that diversity and tolerance are key elements of a strong community, and that every citizen has the right to live without fear.
2. The Common Council condemns the circulation of literature that promotes hate and repudiates any organization that produces it.
3. The Common Council endorses the organized community response to the distribution of hate literature that is being coordinated by Bloomington's Safe and Civil City office.
4. The Common Council encourages all businesses and citizens to act individually and as organizations to promote tolerance and diversity.

PASSED and ADOPTED by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, upon this 9th day of November, 1998.




