ORDINANCE 89-23

TO AMEND TITLE 20 OF THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED "ZONING"

WHEREAS, there has been a current trend toward four (4) and five (5) bedroom units in the multi-family zones around the Indiana University campus; and

WHEREAS, current Bloomington Municipal Code standards are insufficient to deal with the higher population and parking impact of such development; and

WHEREAS, updated setback and parking requirements will better match the demands of units occupied by three (3), four (4) or five (5) adults;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. <u>Section 20.08.03.00 Height, Bulk and Density Table</u> shall be amended to read as follows:

SECTION II. Section 20.08.04.00 (1) shall be repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

(1) Townhouse developments require a minimum of 1,200 square feet in RH and 1,320 square feet in RL and RM of usable open space per townhouse unit.

SECTION III. Section 20.08.04.00 (17) shall be deleted.

SECTION IV. Section 20.14.02.00 Table of Required Parking shall be amended to add the following:

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance, amending the Bloomington Municipal Code Zoning requirements, increases "Useable Open Space" by 10% in RM, RL and RH zones; adds 4' to sideyard required in RH zones for each additional story; increases RH rearyard required from 0' to 25'; and increases packing requirements for efficiency and 3, 4 and 5 bedroom units in the multi-family developments. These changes were recommended by the Planning Department staff and approved by the Plan Commission.
