

To Amend Chapter 19.08, Rules and Regulations of Title 19
Subdivisions of the Bloomington Municipal Code

WHEREAS, the Bloomington Plan Commission has considered
and recommended that the Bloomington Municipal
Code be changed;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON
COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, THAT:


SECTION I. Section 19.08.170 streets and alleys.
Subsection (b) to be amended to read as follows: (b) The
streets shall be paved for a minimum width as specified in
the master thoroughfare plan for arterial and collector streets,
thirty-one feet for local streets, and twenty-eight feet
for cul-de-sacs of 600 feet or less.

SECTION II. Section 19.08.170 Streets and Alleys.
Subsection (e) be amended to read as follows: (e) Concrete
sidewalks shall be constructed according to specifications
prepared by the Engineering Department of the City on both
sides of all streets up to but not including the turn-around
at the end of cul-de-sacs. Such sidewalks shall be at least
four feet in width except when located on a collector or
arterial street or on a street abutting a school, park, or
site zoned for business use, in which case the sidewalk shall
be at five feet in width. All sidewalks shall be installed
one foot within the street right-of-way, parallel to the
property line, unless approved otherwise due to constraints
of topography, vegetation, or right-of-way width.

SECTION III. Severability. If any section,
sentence or provision of this ordinance or the application
thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid,
such invalidity shall not affect any of the other parts of
this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid
part, and to the end of the provisions of this chapter are
declared to be severable.

SECTION IV. This ordinance shall be in full force
and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council
and approval by the Mayor.



SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends the subdivision regulations to require sidewalks on cul-de-sac streets of less than 300' in length, currently exempt and decreases the pavement width on cul-de-sac streets from 31 feet to 28 feet (measured from back of curbs).
