

ORDINANCE 86-29

To Amend Chapter 20.04.01.00 of Title 20
of the Bloomington Municipal Code

WHEREAS, the Bloomington Plan Commission has considered and recommended that the Bloomington Municipal Code be changed;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT;

SECTION I. Section 20.04 (Definitions), Subsection 20.04.01.00 be amended to read as follows:

"Day Care Home" means a private residence which receives for care, maintenance, and supervision from one to ten children for less than 24 hours per day, plus not more than five children for four hours per day or less, both including resident children under the age of fourteen.

SECTION II. Section 20.07 (Land Use Regulations), Subsection 20.07.04.00.B.11 of the tabular summary of land use regulations be amended to read as follows:

SECTION III. Section 20.07 (Land Use Regulations) be amended to add Footnote 22 as follows:

(22) Day care homes accommodating from one to five children, including resident children under the age of 14, are permitted without occupancy permit. Day care homes accommodating from 6 to 15 children shall be required to secure an occupancy permit. Any required State of Indiana license shall be secured before occupancy permit is issued.

SECTION IV. Severability. If any section, sentence or provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any of the other parts of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid part, and to this end the provisions of this chapter are declared to be severable.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

Approval of this ordinance would increase the number of children permitted in a "day care home" from the current maximum of 10 to 10 plus 5 part-time children and specify a State license as a pre-condition to local occupancy permit for homes accommodating 6-15 children. Homes for 1-5 would need no license.
