





SYNOPSIS

This Resolution authorizes written approval of a disclosure of pecuniary interest in a contract or purchase filed by David Liebl on May 23, 1986. Mr. Liebl presently serves as a Common Council appointment to the Utilities Service Board and has been offered the position of Director of the SPEA PCB Laboratory, contingent on funding being obtained to conduct testing of well water samples for PCBs. Approval of the disclosure is required by Indiana law, prior to approval of any contract by the Utilities Service Board.

This letter is to disclose to you a conflict of interest involving the discharge of my duties as a member of the Bloomington Utilities Service Board. The nature of the conflict is as follows:

I.U. SPEA has made an offer of employment to me for the position of Director of the SPEA PCB Laboratory. The offer is contingent on funding for the Laboratory being obtained and would take effect immediately upon receipt of those funds. I.U. SPEA has presented a proposal to the Utilities Service Board staff to conduct testing of well water samples for PCB pursuant to Section XIII, paragraph 71 of the Consent Decree. Should this proposal be approved by the USB, funds from it will be used by SPEA to pay my salary. In addition SPEA may submit future proposals which would include funding for my salary.

In order that this conflict does not jeopardize my ability to function as a USB member and in order that I comply with the pertinent State and City statutes, I am submitting this disclosure for your approval and will disqualify myself from any Board deliberations and action concerning this conflict of interest.

I affirm under the penalties of perjury that the foregoing representations are true.
