ORDINANCE 85-52 To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978 RE: 1800 Block N. Walnut (Hung/Chan)

WHEREAS,

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the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

S, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-77-85 and recommended that the petitioner Hung/Chan, be granted an amendment to the Bloomington Zoning Maps and requests that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property;

OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from RH to BA for property located at 1200 Block of North Walnut Street and more particularly described as follows:

A part of the Southwest quarter of Section 28, Township 9 North, Range 1 West, Monroe County, Indiana described as follows: Beginning at a point that is 1183.00 feet NO1 -26'W and 22.00 feet S88 -49'W of the Southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of said Section 28, said point of beginning being on the west right of way of Dunn Street, thence S88 -49' W over and along the North line of Miller Courts Addition for a distance of 929.73 feet, thence North for a distance of 375.75 feet, to the real point of beginning, thence S88 -32'W for a distance of 644.26 feet to the East right of way of Indiana State Road 37 (North Walnut St.) thence N10 -22 -27"W over and along said East right of way for a distance of 323.02 feet, thence leaving said right of way N88 -26'E for a distance of 390.38 feet, thence S01 -34'E for a distance of 177.74 feet, thence N88 -26'E for a distance of 359.01 feet, thence South for a distance o of 142.74 feet, thence S88 -32'W for a distance of 51.77 feet to the real point of beginning 3.860 acres, more or less.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
