ORDINANCE 82-61

To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Councel passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has considered this case, ZO-24-82 and recommended that the petitioner, The City of Bloomington be granted an amendment to the Bloomington zoning maps and request that the Common Council consider their petition for rezoning of certain property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCEL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be changed from <u>SI (Special Institutional) to RS (Residential Single Family)</u> for property located at <u>the 300 blocks of North Jefferson and North Bryan</u> more particularly described as follows:

Lots 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26 of Block J of Highland Homes Addition.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
