## ORDINANCE 82-81

## TO AMEND THE 1983 SALARY ORDINANCE FOR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES (REORGANIZATION OF CASCADES GOLF COURSE)

## SYNOPSIS

The Parks and Recreation Department is reorganizing the Cascades Golf Course personnel staff in the interest of increasing efficiency by consolidating the administration of three previously-separate functions under the responsibility of a general manager. This ordinance would eliminate the position of Golf Professional and replace it with the position of Golf Course Manager. The Greenskeeper's position is being retitled Golf Course Superintendent to emphasize its responsibility for course maintenance. The 1983 tax-based salary for both positions will remain the same.
