## **RESOLUTION 82-4**

To Impose a Ninety-Day Moratorium on Collection Of Fees for On-Street Parking Meters

WHEREAS, a ninety-day trial period has been proposed to test the feasibility of the new policy;

A ninety-day moratorium on the collection of fees for on-street parking meters shall be imposed as of the effective date of this resolution.
