To Express Support for an Immediate Halt to the Nuclear Arms Race

- WHEREAS, there is a nation-wide campaign underway to encourage negotiations between the U.S. and the U.S.S.R. for an immediate halt to the nuclear arms race; and
- WHEREAS, The Mayor's Committee on Nuclear Awareness has studied this issue and has concluded that the nuclear arms race imperils us all, and that there is no reasonable way to respond at the local level to the ravages of a nuclear holocaust,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Mayor and Common Council express their support for a proposal between the U.S. and U.S.S.R., which is mutually verifiable, to negotiate an immediate halt to the nuclear arms race, and request each country to adopt an immediate mutual freeze on all further testing, production, and deployment of all nuclear warheads, missiles, and delivery systems.
