## To Amend the Bloomington Zoning Maps, Dated June 7, 1978

WHEREAS, the Common Council passed a Zoning Ordinance amendment and adopted new incorporated zoning maps on June 7, 1978 which are now incorporated in Title 20 of the Bloomington Municipal Code; and

SECTION I. Through the authority of IC 18-7-4 that the zoning be amended to designate property "Historic" property located at 625 North Walnut Street more particularly described as follows:

> Lot #36 Hunter's Addition to the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Section 33, commencing on the west side of Walnut Street, 65 feet by 132 feet.
