Informed of Matters of Major Importance in Their Districts


WHEREAS, the administration is often privy to certain information unavailable to Council members; and

WHEREAS, Council members are charged with representing the residents of their districts and must therefore keep informed on matters of concern to their constituents;



The Common Council requests that the administration make every effort to contact a Council member when a matter of major importance of which the Council member may not be aware is planned for or is occurring in his or her district.


