

ORDINANCE 79- 86

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, that the City Controller may adjust the appropriations of the following budgets, to wit:

SYNOPSIS
Ordinance 79-86

This ordinance transfers existing appropriations within the General Fund of the City of Bloomington.

The Human Resources Department is transferring to provide office supplies for the remainder of the year and to enable the printing of more IRIS Manuals.

The transfer in Board of Public Safety is between two separately kept divisions of one line item, the City's portion of the new fire pension and of the new police pension. The transfer is requested simply so that the City's ledgers will accurately reflect the cost of each department's fringe benefits this year.
