

ORDINANCE 79-87

To Repeal Chapter 4.08 of the Bloomington
Municipal Code, Entitled "Barbers and Barbershops"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON,
MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. Chapter 4.08 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled
"Barbers and Barbershops" is hereby repealed.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and
after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

In 1938 an ordinance was passed to regulate barbershops in Bloomington and it provided that licenses be issued by a board of barber examiners. Since that time the state has adopted a comprehensive set of rules and regulations for barbers and it provides that all barbers in the state be licensed by the state board of barber examiners. Because of the questionable legality of a city's regulating a profession that is already regulated by the state and because Bloomington is the only city in the state that still regulates barbers, the barber provisions in the Code are being repealed by this ordinance, which is sponsored by Councilmember Olcott.
