SYNOPSIS

Resolution 79-20

Pursuant to State law, if City funds will be used to purchase a membership in an organization during the coming year, that organization must be specified in a Council resolution at budget time.

The law further stipulates that only those organizations are eligible for inclusion which have as their main purpose "the betterment and improvement of municipal operations."

The true cost of memberships purchased by the City is difficult to assess; obviously there will be predictable expenditure out of several City funds, but the countervailing benefits are harder to quantify. Most of the memberships produce a more informed City work-force which makes fewer expensive errors and knows how to look for cost-saving opportunities.

Many of Parks and Recreation's memberships are necessary for sports program participation and are therefore simply operation costs.

All of the memberships allow citizens, employees, and officials of the City to meet others involved in similar activities; the resulting network of communications in invaluable.
