To Recommend that the Civil City Obtain Its Own Computer Facility

- WHEREAS, the Civil City and Utilities Department have discussed the possibility of obtaining one central facility to handle all computer functions of the two entities; and
- WHEREAS, a study group composed of representatives of the Council, Controller's Office, and Utilities Department was established to examine whether such a joint venture would be feasible; and
- WHEREAS, the computer study group has recommended that the Civil City obtain its own computer separate from that obtained by the Utilities Department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Bloomington Common Council adopts the recommendations of the computer study group that the Civil City proceed with obtaining its own computer facility separate and distinct from the computer facility of the Utilities Department.
