WHEREAS, City employees serving on boards and commissions are also likely to represent the interests of the residents of Bloomington both

WHEREAS, some City boards and commissions require that appointees be City employees,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

Section 2.02.040 of the Bloomington Municipal Code be SECTION I. amended to read as follows:

Section 2.02.040 Appointments—Residential Requirement.

All appointments to city boards and commissions shall be made from persons who, at the time of their appointment, are either residents and/or employees of the city except those positions on boards and commissions that are specifically required or allowed by state law or city ordinance. fically required or allowed by state law or city ordinance to be made from persons who are not residents and/or employees of the city of Bloomington.
