## APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 78-11

AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE CUMULATIVE CAPITAL FUND EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that it is now necessary to appropriate more money than was appropriated in the annual budget; now, therefore,

SECTION I. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, of Monroe County, Indiana that for the expenses of said municipal corporation of the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart out of the several funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:

## SYNOPSIS

## Appropriation Ordinance 78-11

Two appropriations for construction within the Parks and Recreation Department are accomplished by this ordinance.

Dyer School Area Construction was scheduled for \$20,000.00 in this year's Capital Improvement Budget. \$10,000 of that amount was appropriated last spring; the second \$10,000 could not be appropriated until the Utilities Department repaid a loan made several years ago from Cumulative Capital. That loan has now been repaid, and the Parks and Recreation department is anxious to complete the Dyer Area Construction before winter.

The second appropriation is simply a bookkeeping procedure. Parks and Recreation is the recipient of Department of Natural Resources money for the Winslow Sports Complex. That money must be appropriated before it can be dispersed.
