AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 4.12 OF THE BLOOMINGTON MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED, "AUCTIONEERS"

WHEREAS, IC 25-6-1-19 supersedes the authority of any political subdivision to license auctioneers in any manner;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, That:

SECTION 1. Chapter 4.12 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled, "auctioneers" is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

ORDINANCE NO. 77-25

Chapter 4.12 of the Bloomington Municipal Code, entitled, "Auctioneer", was a licensing provision. Indiana statutes in 1905 and 1933 gave the cities the power to license auctioneers. In 1967 a state licensing law was passed which superseded the former statutes and removed the power of the cities to license auctioneers. This ordinance repeals the Bloomington Municipal Code Chapter on Auctioneers to bring the Code into conformity with state law.
