## Ordinance $77 - \frac{67}{2}$

AN ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN DEPARTMENTS IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE HIGHWAY FUND OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.

The Street Department faces several problems which they have chosen to solve through transfer to be made possible by a general across-the-board cutting of appropriations.

The salary appropriations can be cut because there were no summer hires and only one part-time worker this year, and this results in cuts in insurance and retirement. The other cuts will be accomodated by similarly conservative spending.

This will make possible the maintenance of roads and rights-of-way especially those steeets recently received for maintenance from the State. Two large trucks will be purchased which will be general-purpose but are primarily needed for snow removal. Purchase of a striper and supplies necessary for these projects will also be funded.
