## SYNOPSIS

# Ordinance 77-79

## Budget Transfers

This ordinance solves some financial problems for four City departments through appropriations transfer so that special appropriations are not necessary.

The utilities line item for the Animal Shelter was underbudgeted for this year, and the Shelter is requesting additional money to cover these expenses; it also needs a refrigerator, office furniture, and perhaps additional money to purchase a new incinerator. The Board of Public Works will be paying \$1,500 to Marvard Clark for serving as a consultant to the Engineering Department, \$100 for an increase in dues to the U.S. Conference of Mayors, and \$1,000 for building materials needed to continue renovations of the Municipal Building. The Controller's Office needs additional funds to cover various expenses of the grantsperson, including postage and phone bills. The Fire Department is requesting \$22,500 to repair or rebuild the Department's snorkel, and this figure represents the maximum amount such repairs would cost.
