## APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 77 - 22

AN ORDINANCE SPECIALLY APPROPRIATING FROM THE CUMULATIVE CAPITAL FUND EXEENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA.
