Salary Ordinance for Department of Human Resources

Whenever new positions are created in the City of Bloomington, a salary ordinance is required regulating the maximum rate of pay. The Department of Human Resources is in the process of becoming the grantee for the Title VII Nutrition Program under the Older Americans Act of 1965, as amended. This program will provide meals for older citizens at various sites in the community. The Project Director will be responsible for administering the overall program; the Site Managers will direct the serving of meals.
