AN ORDINANCE TO TRANSFER APPROPRIATIONS WITHIN THE GENERAL FUND

When money is budgeted for use by the City departments, it is broken into "line items", such as services personal, equipment, etc. State law requires that money from one item cannot be used for something covered by another line item without a budget transfer by action of the Common Council.

The Council office is concerned that there was an insufficient appropriation made last year for office supplies; they also find that they are not using work-study at the rate anticipated and wish to use that excess appropriat₁ on to cover office supplies.
