SYNOPSIS

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 76-8

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING TRUST FUND TO THE HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT, ECONOMIC DEVEL-OPMENT COMMISSION AND BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

This Ordinance requests an appropriation of \$45,706 from the Federal General Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purposes of developing youth planning and programming and providing staff support for economic development activities.

A total of \$37,546 has been earmarked for the creation of a coordinated plan of services essential to youth program development and enables the Human Resources Department to contract with community agencies for the provision of youth services.

The remaining \$11,160 provides for the funding of a position of Economic Development Coordinator in the City administration. The position was legally authorized by the Common Council through salary ordinance in 1975.
