ORDINANCE NO. 66-56

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE INSTALLATION AND PAINTING OF FIRE HYDRANTS AND PROHIBITING THE OBSTRUCTION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Indiana:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to place, park, $\overline{\text{plant}}$, $\overline{\text{build}}$, erect or maintain any object or material which will obstruct or hinder in any manner the operation or use of any fire hydrant within the City of Bloomington.

Section 2. No fire hydrant shall be painted except by authorized personnel of the City of Bloomington.

Section 3. Before the installation of any fire hydrant which will use water from the City of Bloomington water system, the plans and specifications of such installation shall be approved by the office of the City Engineer. All such installation shall be of a type of hydrant designated by the Fire Chief of the City of Bloomington as suitable.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, promulgation and publication in accordance with the law.
