An Ordinance authorizing the sale of certain personal property owned by the City of Bloomington, pursuant to the "Fiftieth" clause of the powers granted to the Common Council pursuant to Chapter 129, Section 53 of the Acts of 1905.

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington is the owner of a trained police dog, to-wit: a red and rust colored Doberman Pinscher, American Kennel Club registration number WA-77367, and registered name of "Big T's Town Crier".

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Common Council that said dog is no longer needed for police work, and therefore there is no reason to retain said dog in the Bloomington Police Department.

WHEREAS, the Common Council believes that said dog should be sold and that it would be to the best interests of the City that said dog be sold as surplus property.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the police dog described as follows, to-wit:

A red and rust colored Doberman Pinscher, American Kennel Club registration number WA-77367, and registered name of "Big T's Town Crier".

be sold on such terms, conditions and in such manner as may be prescribed by the Monroe Circuit Court for an amount not less than the full appraised value.

Section 2. Be it further Ordained, that the City Attorney be, and he is, hereby directed to file a petition with the Monroe Circuit Court requesting the appointment of three disinterested free holders of the City of Bloomington to appraise said dog. Said appraisal to be made pursuant to the statutes of the State of Indiana pertaining to the sale of municipal property. That said appraisers to appraise said dog on the basis of its further usefulness as a trained police dog and not on the fasis of being only a registered dog.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, that the Clerk-Treasurer of the City shall prepare and execute from certified copies of the ordinance to be presented to the Judge of the Circuit Court of Monroe County and filed with the petition which the City Attorney has been directed to file with the Judge of the Monroe Circuit Court for the above appraisal.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, that the Mayor of this City and the Clerk-Treasurer shall, and they are, hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary steps to effectuate the transfer of said dog, and to sign any and all necessary papers required at the earliest practi-ord, dotte cal date after receiving authority so to do from the Monroe Circuit Court.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
