

Appropriation Ordinance 2026-01 to Additionally Appropriate from the Parking Meter Fund for Parking Lot Resurfacing

Preamble

Whereas, on December 16, 2025, Parking Services, under the Department of Public Works, awarded a contract for resurfacing of Parking Lots 1, 3, and 5 (4th & Dunn, 4th & Washington, and 6th & Lincoln), which included milling, surfacing and striping, and ADA improvements, out of 2025 appropriations in the Parking Meter Fund (F2207) with work to be completed by June 12, 2026;

Whereas, on or about May 29, 2026, Parking Services was notified by the chosen vendor that they would be unable to honor the awarded contract;

Whereas, the next lowest responsive and responsible bidder is able to perform the services for the price they quoted on December 16, 2025;

Whereas, the funds for this project were included in the 2025 appropriations within the Parking Meter Fund, but the change in contractor and amount requires that the original appropriation revert back to the Parking Meter Fund and necessitates a new appropriation to award the contract to a new vendor;

Whereas, the Department of Public Works requests to additionally appropriate from the Parking Meter Fund (F2207) Other Services and Charges (Classification 3) the same amount that is being reverted in order to award the contract and complete the paving of Lots 1, 3, and 5;

Whereas, notice of a Public Hearing on said appropriation has been duly given by publication as required by law, and the hearing on said appropriation has been held, at which all taxpayers and other interested persons had an opportunity to appear and express their views as to such appropriation; and

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Bloomington now finds that all conditions precedent to the adoption of an ordinance authorizing an additional appropriation of the City have been complied with in accordance with Indiana law.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby ordained by the Common Council of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, that:

SECTION 1. For the expenses of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County Indiana, the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart from the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:

APPROPRIATION

Parking Meter Fund (F2207) - Parking

Classification 3 – Other Services and Charges \$134,139

Total Parking Meter Fund (F2207) \$134,139

SECTION 2. Each of the Mayor and the Controller is hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of the City, to execute and deliver any agreement, certificate or other instrument or take any other action which such officer determines to be necessary or desirable to carry out the intent of this Ordinance, including the filing of a report of an additional appropriation with the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance, which determination shall be conclusively evidenced by such officer's having executed

such agreement, certificate or other instrument or having taken such other action, and any such agreement, certificate or other instrument heretofore executed and delivered and any such other action heretofore taken are hereby ratified and approved.
