SYNOPSIS

This amendment adds a new position to the 1989 salary ordinance, consistent with the recently implemented pay classification system, that properly classifies an Assistant Chemist in the Utilities Lab Department. The Assistant Chemist position is required to facilitate staffing requirements. A person is needed with advanced technical expertise in the principles and practices of water quality testing. A salary amendment is also needed for the Assistant Director of Utilities position to bring the salary in line with the skills, responsibilities and job requirements for the position.
