

ORDINANCE 79-16

To Amend the Salary Ordinance for Appointed Officers
and Employees and Create the Position of "Laborer's Aide"

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON,
MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. That from and after the twenty-second day of February, 1979,
the salary and pay schedule for the following appointed officers and employees
of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, be fixed as follows:

SALARY SCHEDULE AS PRESENTED BY

FEBRUARY 2, 1979

TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

I, the undersigned, Francis X. McCloskey, Mayor of the City of Bloomington,
Indiana, as required by IC 18-2-1-10 hereby amend the salary and pay schedule
for the following appointed employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana,
beginning February 16, 1979, and continuing thereafter until duly changed, and
request that such salary rates be approved by the Common Council of said City,
to wit:

SECTION II. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed
above are maximum rates.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and

SYNOPSIS

This amendment to the salary ordinance would create an entry-level position
to allow the City to employ CETA eligible persons for CETA Special Projects Grants.
Given the revised guidelines which are set by Federal Regulations, a CETA position
must be entry level. With salary restrictions imposed by the State of Indiana for
CETA Special Projects Employees, it is impossible to employ any projects persons
in present classifications or pay grades, thus creating the need for the entry
level "Laborer's Aide" position.
