

ORDINANCE 79-63

To Amend 1979 Salary Ordinance to
Reclassify the Position of
Assistant to Deputy City Engineer

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

SECTION I. That from and after the 10th day of September, 1979, the salary and pay schedule of the following employee of the City of Bloomington, be fixed as follows:

SALARY SCHEDULE AS PRESENTED BY
MAYOR FRANCIS X. McCLOSKEY


I, the undersigned, Francis X. McCloskey, Mayor of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, as required by IC 18-2-1-10 hereby fix the salary for the following employee of the City of Bloomington, beginning September 10, 1979 and continuing thereafter until December 31, 1979, and request that such salary rate be approved by the Common Council:

SECTION II. The rate shown as the salary for the position listed above is the maximum rate and shall go into effect as of September 10, 1979.

SECTION III. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

This ordinance amends the 1978 Salary Ordinance by reclassifying the position of Assistant City Engineer to Deputy City Engineer and increasing the salary from \$16,320 to \$17,320. The State Board of Accounts suggests that the position be reclassified since the salary ordinance cannot be amended after it has been passed, unless there is a new position, reclassification, or a change in an hourly wage. The City is in the process of recruiting the Assistant City Engineer and the salary must be raised to be more competitive with the private sector.
