

ORDINANCE NO. 79-98

Salary Ordinance for Appointed Officers and Employees, to fix the salary of New Project Director, Human Resources Department.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

SECTION I. That from and after the first day of January, 1980, the salary and pay schedule of the following appointed employee of the City of Bloomington, Monroe County, Indiana, be fixed as follows:
