

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF UTILITIES EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, FOR THE YEAR 1979.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the resolution of the Utilities Service Board of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, the salary and pay schedule for the following employee position of the said Board from and after the 10th day of December, 1979, shall be as follows:

<u>PAYGRADE</u>	<u>CLASSIFICATION</u>	<u>SALARIED JOB RATE</u>
30	Utility and Safety Engineer	\$23,365

SECTION 2. Pursuant to the resolution of the Utilities Service Board of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, the salary and pay schedule for the following employee position of the said Board from and after the first day of January 1980, shall be as follows:

<u>PAYGRADE</u>	<u>CLASSIFICATION</u>	<u>SALARIED JOB RATE</u>
30	Utility and Safety Engineer	\$25,000

SECTION 3. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed previously are maximum rates.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor.
