AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF EMPLOYEES AND OFFICERS OF THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA, FOR THE YEAR 1979

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

"Hourly employees working on the evening or night shift shall receive a .10¢/hour shift premium. Salaried employees working on the evening or night shift shall receive a \$4.00/week shift premium."

SECTION V. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed above are the maximum rates, with the following exceptions:

The job rates for the position classifications listed below shall be the maximum rate of pay during 1979 for all employees hired after December 31, 1978:

An employee who is transferred, reallocated, or promoted to a position in a class in a pay grade higher than that of the class from which the employee is transferred shall be paid the job rate of the new class, provided however, that an employee who, prior to transfer, was paid at a salary rate higher than his/her job rate shall upon transfer, be paid at a rate which is the sum of the job rate of the new class plus the differential between the employee's former salary rate and the employee's former job rate; provided further, that no employee so transferred or promoted shall receive more than the highest paid employee in the City in the same classification. An employee who is transferred to a position in a pay grade lower than that of the class from which the employee is transferred shall be paid the job rate of the new classification; provided however, that an employee who, prior to transfer, was paid at a salary rate higher than the job rate for his/her classification shall, upon transfer, be paid at a rate which is the sum of the job rate of the new class plus the differential between the employee's former salary rate and the employee's former job rate; provided further that no employee so transferred or promoted shall receive more than the highest paid employee in the City in the same classification.

ORDINANCE NO. 78-62

SALARY ORDINANCE FOR POLICE AND FIRE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

An employee who, for disciplinary reasons or at his/her election in lieu of a layoff, is demoted to a class position in a lower pay grade shall be paid at the job rate for the position to which the employee is demoted.

SECTION VI. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

SYNOPSIS

ORDINANCE NO. 78-62

State Statute requires that the Mayor submit to the Council, prior to the end of each year, an Ordinance setting the maximum salaries of Police and Fire Departments' employees for the coming year. At the Council's request, this Ordinance has been prepared for consideration prior to the 1979 budget. Its provisions create the framework for Police and Fire Salary and Wage line items in the 1979 City budget.
