

SALARY ORDINANCE FOR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 1977

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION I. That from and after the first day of January, 1977, the salary and pay schedule of the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, be fixed as follows:

SALARY SCHEDULE AS PRESENTED BY

TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON:

I, the undersigned, Francis X. McCloskey, Mayor of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as required by Chapter 107 of the Acts of 1959, hereby fix the salaries for the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, beginning January 1, 1977, and continuing thereafter until duly changed, and request that such salary rates be approved by the Common Council of said City, to wit:

SECTION II. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed above are maximum rates.

SYNOPSIS

To Amend the Salary Ordinance for 1977

According to State law, the maximum salaries of City employees must be fixed annually by the first day of August for the following year. If there is a new position created during the year or if duties and responsibilities of a present position are altered, the original salary ordinance must be amended to include it.

This ordinance amends the salary ordinance passed in August by expanding the present position of Secretary II to Deputy City Clerk for Council Operations. The expansion of the duties of this position are offset by the elimination of one position in the Council Office. Significant savings and centralization of operations should result.


