

SALARY ORDINANCE FOR APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF APPOINTED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA FOR THE YEAR 1976.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA:

SECTION I. That from and after the first day of July, 1976, the salary and pay schedule of the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, be fixed as follows:

July 1, 1976

TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON:

I, the undersigned, Francis X. McCloskey, Mayor of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, as required by Chapter 107 of the Acts of 1959, hereby fix the salaries and pay schedule for the following appointed officers and employees of the City of Bloomington, Indiana, beginning July 1, 1976, and continuing thereafter until duly changed, and request that such salary rates be approved by the Common Council of said City, to-wit:

Utilities Department


Assistant Director of Utilities \$21,150.

SECTION II. The rates shown as wages and salaries for the positions listed above are maximum rates.

SECTION III. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor.





## SYNOPSIS

## ORDINANCE 76-50

To Amend the Salary Ordinance for 1976

According to State law, the maximum salaries of all City employees must be fixed annually by the first day of August for the following year. If there is a new position created during the year, the original salary ordinance must be amended to include it.

This ordinance amends the original salary ordinance passed last year in August. It creates the new position of Assistant Director of Utilities, and sets the maximum pay for that position at \$21,150.
