
Denouncing Acts of Violence

- Whereas, Bloomington is a thriving community with lively public discourse and where there is no room for acts of violence; and
- Whereas, it is through public discourse that we sort out our individual differences and realize what is true and what is false, gain information in order to make personal decisions about the course of our own futures, and decide through the political process upon collective action for the common good; and
- Whereas, we are presently in the midst of such discourse regarding growth in our community and the effects urban sprawl and traffic congestion have on the character of our community and the quality of our lives; and
- Whereas, the discourse has been largely positive and constructive, with citizens engaging others in debate, becoming educated on the issues, participating in the political process, and exploring local solutions to very difficult issues; and
- Whereas, it now appears that the recent fire of a home under construction in Sterling Woods subdivision was an act of arson carried out under the pretense of a political statement about urban sprawl; and
- Whereas, such acts of violence are serious violations of the law that clearly breach the limit of civility and must not be tolerated because they instill fear and promote rage, and drive us apart as a community rather than reaffirm our respect for one another;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

1. The Common Council denounces such acts of violence.
2. The Common Council extends its sympathy to the Scott family for the damage to their property.
3. The Common Council urges members of the community to engage in constructive and non-violent discourse.
