

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE 99-02

TO SPECIALLY APPROPRIATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND  
EXPENDITURES NOT OTHERWISE APPROPRIATED  
(Grants – Use of a Portion of the Proceeds from the Sale of the Sanitation Garage  
To Augment the Housing Trust Fund)

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington Board of Public Works sold property located at 511 West Fourth Street, Bloomington, Indiana, more particularly described as Part of In-lots Number 67 and 68 of the Original Plat of Bloomington, Indiana (the "Property"), which was formerly used as the site of the City's sanitation garage; and

WHEREAS, the proceeds from the sale of the Property, \$108,000, were deposited into the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 98-14, which authorized the sale of this property, was amended by the Common Council to set aside five percent of these proceeds, \$5,400, for Housing Trust Fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:


SECTION I. For the expenses of said municipal corporation, the following additional sums of money are hereby appropriated and ordered set apart from the funds herein named and for the purposes herein specified, subject to the laws governing the same:




