
Supporting Employees' Right to Organize

- WHEREAS, Federal law protects employees' rights to form or join a union; and
- WHEREAS, threats to close facilities, fire union activists, or otherwise retaliate against workers have been used to interfere with employee's efforts to exercise their right to unionize; and
- WHEREAS, these intrusions often deprive employees of an opportunity to decide whether to unionize free from intimidation or coercion; and
- WHEREAS, employers who choose to interfere in the election process often stall or delay proceedings before the National Labor Relations Board that are intended to allow employees an expeditious means of selecting a union to represent them; and
- WHEREAS, unions provide employees with a voice on the job, encourage job innovation, productivity and growth; and
- WHEREAS, unionized employees generally earn more than their non-union counterparts, contribute to the economic vitality of our communities, and unions have contributed to the growth of democracy and the well-being of America's working families;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:


- Section 1. The Common Council supports the right of working people in our community to choose a union to better their conditions of employment.
- Section 2. The Common Council urges all employers within our community to respect this right by ensuring that their employees' opportunity to choose whether or not to unionize is free from intimidation or coercion and communication to employees that the employer will deal fairly with any union that may be selected.
- Section 3. The Common Council urges all employers to honor their employees' decision to be represented by a union by engaging in card-check elections and thereby avoiding the delays and legal maneuvering that accompany NLRB election processes.
