SYNOPSIS

This appropriation ordinance makes two end-of-the-year appropriations relating to the General F und. The first appropriation is an authorization to transfer \$600 in the Council Office from other categories to salaries and wages in order to fund the Council Intern until the close of the year.

The second appropriation fulfills some obligations to Bloomington Community Access TV that a tose last June when the City agreed to extend the Cable Franchise Agreement for two years and authorized an increase in the franchise fee. As part of the agreement to extend the cable f anchise, TCI provided a \$10,000 cash grant for BCAT to acquire some hardware. The City has received the money and through this appropriation will forward it to BCAT. And, when the City increased the cable franchise fees last June, TCI was no longer contractually required to give BCAT an annual contribution of \$35,000. TCI had provided half that amount for the f rst six months in the year, and this appropriation provides BCAT with \$17,500 to make up the other half.

Since the first appropriation is a transfer and the second is out of unbudgeted revenues, the Controllers Office reports that there will be no fiscal impact on the 1996 budget.

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
