**RESOLUTION 95-04**

**RESOLUTION TO ENCOURAGE AFFORDABLE HOUSING  
IN THE DOWNTOWN AREA**

WHEREAS, there is a shortage of affordable housing in Bloomington, particularly in the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington and the Common Council are on record as supporting the development of more affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, development of affordable housing often requires all parties to the planning and zoning process - petitioner, neighbors, community and government - to make sacrifices towards and encourage initiatives that promote the greater common good; and

WHEREAS, a recently proposed innovative approach to address the lack of affordable housing in the downtown area was withdrawn from the planning and zoning process by the petitioner; and


WHEREAS, the neighbors to said development generally supported the development but wanted to more fully discuss certain aspects of the project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bloomington and the Common Council should, among other responsibilities, act as moderators and facilitate a reasonable and mutually agreeable solution; and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

1. The Common Council calls upon all parties to the recently withdrawn affordable housing development downtown to sit down with representatives of the Council acting as facilitator and resolve as many differences as is reasonably possible.
2. The Common Council calls upon the petitioner to resubmit the affordable housing development plan and the neighborhood representatives to discuss with the petitioner only those matters within the petitioner's control, and further calls upon the City administration to support efforts to see that this affordable housing development proceeds in a timely and judicious manner.
3. The Common Council calls upon the Board of Zoning Appeals to hear and vote on the innovative affordable housing development proposed for the downtown area as soon as legally and practically permissible.
