## **RESOLUTION 95-13**

## REQUESTING THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING TASK FORCE TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON HOW THE ZONING CODE CAN ENCOURAGE THE USE OF ACCESSORY APARTMENTS AND CO-OPERATIVE HOUSING TO CREATE MORE AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN BLOOMINGTON

- WHEREAS, there is a crisis in the lack of affordable and low-cost rental and owner occupied housing which threatens the quality of life for many citizens of Bloomington; and
- WHEREAS, the Growth Policies Plan called for the creation of an Affordable Housing Task Force to address this issue, which the Common Council did in Resolution 94-55; and
- WHEREAS, the zoning code as a land use planning tool is an appropriate means to encourage affordable housing; and
- WHEREAS, the Common Council recently considered in the hearings on the new zoning ordinance using both accessory apartments and co-operative housing as a means to encourage affordable housing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLOOMINGTON, MONROE COUNTY, INDIANA, THAT:

The Common Council calls upon the Affordable Housing Task Force to investigate, evaluate and make recommendations to this Council no later than July 4, 1995 as to how accessory apartments, co-operative housing and other land-use based concepts can be incorporated into our zoning ordinance to encourage low-cost and affordable housing.
